God's Thankful People

*Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God
in Christ Jesus for you – 1 Thess. 5:18*

This year Americans celebrate Thanksgiving Day on Thursday, November 27. The roots of Thanksgiving can be traced to the year 1621, when the Plymouth colonists, known as the Pilgrims, and the Native American Wampanoag people shared a three-day feast whose purpose, for the Pilgrims, was to thank God for the bountiful harvest he provided. This celebratory feast, organized by Governor William Bradford, is commonly acknowledged as America's first Thanksgiving, though the Pilgrims themselves likely did not use the term at the time.

After this first Thanksgiving, days of thanksgiving were celebrated by individual colonies and states for more than two centuries. However, it wasn't until 1863, at the height of the Civil War, that President Lincoln proclaimed a national Thanksgiving Day to be held each final Thursday in November. Thanksgiving was then celebrated on this day until 1939 when President Roosevelt moved the holiday up a week hoping to spur retail sales during the Great Depression. Roosevelt's plan, mockingly known as "Franksgiving," was strongly opposed by the American populace. In 1941, President Roosevelt reluctantly signed a bill that officially made Thanksgiving Day the fourth Thursday in November.

While it is wonderful to have a National Day of Thanksgiving (though, sadly, our nation has lost the true meaning of the day), for the Christian Thanksgiving should be more than a holiday we celebrate with family and friends once a year. It should be the persistent attitude of our heart. For when we reflect on all that God has done for us in Jesus Christ, we should be the most thankful people on earth every day God gives us breath. And not only when life is good, but in every circumstance.

Think of the Pilgrims who celebrated the first Thanksgiving. They had endured great loss, extreme hardship, and continual uncertainty. Yet, they set aside time to thank God – not for perfect circumstances, but for his sustaining grace in the midst of their imperfect circumstances. As Paul discovered centuries before them, God's grace proved sufficient for their needs and his power was perfected in their weakness and they were very thankful for his grace.

So, as we gather together this Thanksgiving with family and friends on our national holiday, let us thank God for a day to remember his manifold blessings upon this nation. And let us pray for God to have mercy upon us. For we are desperately in need of a spiritual awakening. But as those whom God has saved by his grace from his judgment and granted eternal life, let us not forget to thank him for the redemptive blessings he has bestowed on us through Christ. For these eternal blessings belong only to the people of God whose true citizenship lies not in America but in the new heaven and earth.

As one author writes:

Only in Jesus Christ are we able to become the kind of thankful people God created us to be. For the Christian, with both feet standing firmly in the good news of Jesus, there are possibilities for a true thanksgiving which we otherwise would never know.
