Jesus is the Christ

*But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son,
born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those
who were under the law, so that we might
receive adoption as sons. – Gal. 4:4-5*

December is the time of year when daylight get shorter, the air gets cooler, Christmas decorations come out of hibernation, and Christmas hymns start showing up in church services. While I'm not a fan of decreasing daylight and frigid temperatures, I do look forward to singing traditional Christmas hymns during the worship service. There is something wonderful about singing hymns with fellow believers that focus our thoughts on the coming of Christ into the world. A coming that was promised by God to our first parents shortly after they sinned, and a coming God continued to affirm by his prophets until the Christ's arrival.

So, as we rightly affirm that Christmas is the story of Christ's birth, it is more than that. It is the fulfillment of God's prophetic word. While there are numerous examples of how the birth of Christ fulfilled certain Old Testament Scriptures, I want us to consider five examples that demonstrate Jesus is the promised Christ.

1. Christ would be born of a virgin.

Prophecy: Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. – Is. 7:14

Fulfillment: She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel." – Mt. 1:21-22

2. Christ would be born in Bethlehem.

Prophecy: But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days. – Micah 5:2

Fulfillment: Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." – Mt. 2:1

3. Christ would come from the tribe of Judah.

Prophecy: The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until tribute comes to him; and to him shall be the obedience of the peoples. – Gen. 49:10

Fulfillment: For it is evident that our Lord was descended from Judah. – Heb. 7:14

4. Christ would be an heir to David's throne.

Prophecy: *Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this. – Is. 9:7.*

Fulfillment: *He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." – Lk. 1:32-33*

5. Christ would be preceded by a forerunner.

Prophecy: *Behold, I send my messenger, and he will prepare the way before me. And the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple; and the messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, behold, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. – Mal. 3:1*

Fulfillment: *As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? What then did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? Behold, those who wear soft clothing are in kings' houses. What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is he of whom it is written, 'Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way before you.' – Mt. 11:7-10*

Jesus is the promised Christ who fulfills the Scriptures that prophesied his coming. Therefore, as we celebrate Christmas, let us keep in mind, we are not simply remembering a birth, we are rejoicing in the faithfulness of God. And just as he kept his promise in the first coming of Christ, we can trust him to keep his word regarding Christ's return. Christmas is, therefore, both a celebration of fulfillment and a call to expectant hope. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!

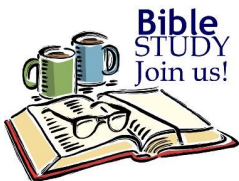

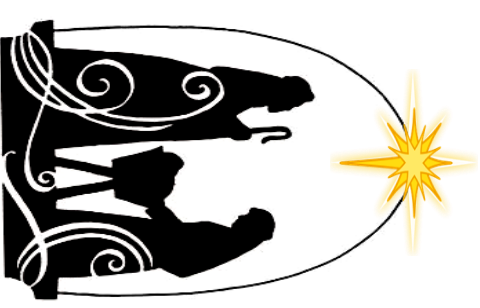
