The Necessity of the Resurrection

... Christ has been raised from the dead – 1 Cor. 15:20

For nearly two thousand years the Christian church has celebrated the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the tomb. This year, we do so on Sunday, April 20th. While Christ's resurrection is a historical fact that all true Christians believe, the question may be asked, "Was it necessary for Christ to rise from the grave?" After all, Jesus did declare from the cross, with his final breath, "It is finished" (Jn. 19:30). So, if his work of atonement was complete, someone may say, "What is the significance of the resurrection?"

To answer that question in detail is not possible in a short article, nor is it necessary. Over the years, numerous good books have been written on the resurrection of Jesus Christ and its significance. So, rather than write an extended discourse, I will give four reasons the resurrection of Jesus was necessary.

First, the resurrection of Jesus Christ proves his words are true. On several occasions, as the time of his death drew near, Jesus told his disciples he would die and rise again. For example, in Mark 9:31, Jesus, who often referred to himself as the "Son of Man," spoke these words to the disciples, "…the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again." So, if Jesus did not rise from the dead as he promised, he would be a false prophet and not the Savior of his people.

Second, the resurrection of Jesus Christ confirms his divine nature. Jesus was both human and divine. He was one person with two natures. In Romans 1:3-4, the apostle Paul says that Jesus, "was descended from David according to the flesh and declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead." So, if Jesus did not rise from the dead, he would not be the Son of God incarnate, as he himself affirmed on several occasions.

Third, the resurrection of Jesus Christ undergirds our justification. Our right standing before God is directly tied to the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The apostle Paul writes of Jesus in Romans 4:25, "who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification." The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the grave is a testimony to God's acceptance of his atoning sacrifice and a validation of his final words from the cross, "It is finished." So, if Jesus did not rise from the dead, God still counts our sins against us and we remain under his wrath and judgment.

Fourth, the resurrection of Jesus Christ is the guarantee of our resurrection. When Jesus rose from the dead, as the first fruits of our resurrection, he not only defeated death for himself, he did so for us as well. Death had no hold on Christ. And because we are in Christ, united to him through faith by the Spirit, death has no hold on us. The apostle Paul emphasizes this truth when he writes in Romans 8:11, "If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you." So, if Jesus did not rise from the dead, we have no hope of an eternal resurrected life.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ was an absolute necessity. Christ must rise from the tomb as victor over the grave or we remain lost in our sins. God saves us through the redemptive work of Jesus Christ that includes both his death and resurrection. So, let us thank God today, tomorrow, and forever for the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the grave. We have no hope without it.


