Every Nation, Tribe, and Tongue

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" – Acts 1:8

The territory of Greenland has been in the news more times these past four months than, perhaps, my entire lifetime. Prior to the Trump administration making Greenland a topic of national conversation, I paid scant attention to the island. So when I recently read an article telling how 18th century Christian missionaries brought the gospel to Greenland and God spiritually transformed the island, I thought it was a story worth sharing. For it not only demonstrates the power of the gospel, it reveals that Jesus is building his church in areas of our world for which we give little thought.

According to the article, Christianity was first brought to Greenland by Norse settlers in the 11th century. But by the 18th century all contact had been lost with the Christian settlements. Curious as to what happened to end all communications, Lutheran pastor Hans Egede, who ministered in Vaagan Norway, set sail for Greenland on May 3, 1721, accompanied by his wife and two sons.

Upon his arrival, pastor Egede was shocked to find no Norse communities. There was no Christian presence in Greenland and it was solely inhabited by Eskimos. Although he was surprised there were no believers on the island, pastor Egede saw the absence of a Christian witness as an opportunity to bring the gospel to an unreached people. So he and his family took up residence in Greenland and received financial support from a company he founded in Norway some time prior to making their trip. Once they were settled, the family then attempted to learn the Eskimo language and culture in order to present the gospel message to the natives.

For several years pastor Egede's evangelistic efforts met with little success. The Eskimos were not interested in the gospel and most turned a deaf ear. But in 1733, twelve years after he and his family arrived in Greenland, things changed for the better and two reasons are cited. First, a smallpox epidemic killed thousands of Eskimos on the island. This tragic event gave pastor Egede and his family an opportunity to minister to the sick and dying. After witnessing their selfless care for their people, the Eskimos were profoundly moved, and the gospel they once rejected was eagerly received. Second, Moravian missionaries arrived that year and they were a great help in the missionary work that pastor Egede and his family pioneered. Due to their combined efforts, the gospel was proclaimed throughout the island and all of Greenland's Eskimos eventually became members of Christian churches.


In 1736, pastor Egede left Greenland and traveled to Denmark to bury his wife and found a school for the training of missionaries to Greenland. He left behind his two sons, Paul and Niels, as well as two nephews, who continued the work of Christian missions. Although he did not return to Greenland, Pastor Egede, with the help of his son Paul, was able to translate the New Testament into the Eskimo language and write an Eskimo grammar, dictionary, and catechism.

Today, because of the evangelistic efforts of the Egede's and the Moravian missionaries, Greenland retains its Christian identity. Of the fifty-seven-thousand people who live on the island, ninety percent of whom are Inuit Eskimos, the vast majority belong to the Lutheran church. While it goes too far to say that every Lutheran Greenlander is a true believer in Christ, the fact the majority of Greenlanders identify as Christians, is a testimony to the grace of God and the power of the gospel in Greenland's history.

Jesus is building his church. Even in areas of our world for which we give little thought. For in these remote regions of our world are people he came to save. Thank God for missionaries like pastor Hans Egede and his family, who will leave behind the comforts of home to travel to the ends of the earth, so a people in darkness may hear the good news of Jesus Christ and, by God's grace, be saved.
