Faith and Politics

For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God – Rom. 13:1

Should faithful Christians run for political office? Some people say, "No," and claim the so-called "separation of church and state" works against such an arrangement. Yet the history of our nation disproves such a notion. Since its founding, there have been many faithful Christians who have served our country in a variety of governmental positions, including the president of the United States. William McKinley Jr. was one such man.

William McKinley Jr. was born on January 29, 1843 to devout Methodist parents in Niles, Ohio. When he turned sixteen, he became a full-fledged member of the Methodist Episcopal Church and remained an active member his entire life. His mother had hoped he would become a gospel minister but God had other plans for his life.

When McKinley was eighteen, he joined the Twenty-third Ohio Volunteer Infantry Regiment, and by the end of the Civil War he had earned the rank of major. Considering the possibility that he could be killed in battle, he wrote in his diary: "Fall in a good cause and hope to fall in the arms of my blessed Redeemer. This record I want left behind, that I not only fell as a soldier for my Country, but also as a Soldier of Jesus. [McKinley's friends and relatives could be comforted with solace] that if we never meet again on earth, we will meet around God's throne in heaven. Let my fate be what it may, I want to be ready and prepared."

After the war McKinley became a successful lawyer in Canton, Ohio, where he married Ida Saxton. After the deaths of their two young children, Ida was stricken with a nervous disorder that left her a semi-invalid. Ever the devoted husband, William McKinley Jr. remained faithful to Ida and cared for her the rest of his life.

Over the years McKinley held various offices within local, state, and federal government. In 1896 he successfully ran as the Republican candidate for president and was inaugurated as the twenty-fifth president of the United States. During his inaugural address, he kissed his Bible and declared that he would be "relying on the support of my countrymen and invoking the guidance of Almighty God. For our faith teaches there is no safer reliance than upon the God of our fathers, who has so singularly favored the American people in every national trial, and who will not forsake us so long as we obey His commandments and walk humbly in His footsteps."

McKinley's Christian faith was often seen in his policies. When America took control of the Philippine Islands from Spain in 1898 and it was unclear what to do next, McKinley prayed to God for guidance. He was eventually led to annex the islands to the United States, promising to educate and evangelize the Filipinos who, he said, were "our fellow men for whom Christ also died."

On September 6, 1901, McKinley was shot by an assassin, whom he publicly forgave. For one week McKinley bravely held on to life. But as the infection from the gunshot spread within his body his condition steadily worsened. Realizing the end was near, McKinley told his doctors, "It is useless gentlemen. I think we ought to have prayer." He said goodbye to his wife and friends and then said weakly, "It is God's way. His will, not ours, be done." After he whispered his last words, lines from his favorite hymn, "Nearer My God to Thee," William McKinley Jr., age 58, took his final breath on earth and his first breath in glory.

William McKinley Jr. was a faithful Christian. He was also a good politician who did not hide his faith or compromise his Christian convictions. Instead, he relied on God to direct his decisions and guide his policies for the benefit of others. May God bless us with men like McKinley to lead our nation today.
