Our Heavenly Intercessor

... Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us – Rom. 8:34

It is always a great comfort to know that people pray for you. To have someone say, "I am praying for you," is a wonderful encouragement, especially in difficult days. Well, if that is true when we know that people pray for us, how much more should we be comforted and encouraged to know that Jesus prays for us and his intercession is never-ending. Day by day, hour by hour, minute by minute, year by year, Jesus prays for us at the right hand of God the Father in heaven. The author of Hebrews mentions Christ's perpetual prayers in chapter 7:25, when he writes, "he always lives to make intercession for them," that is, for his people. As our Great High Priest in heaven, Jesus forever intercedes for us. God's people are truly blessed.

Now, while it is true, Scripture does not reveal the exact content of Jesus' intercessions as he prays for his people in heaven, it does record his parting prayer in John chapter 17. Taking this prayer as a pattern for his intercessions, we can see that Jesus prays for his people in at least seven ways.

Jesus prays for the preservation of his people.

And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled - Jn. 17:11-12

Jesus prays that God the Father will guard his people. He prays for their preservation and perseverance in saving faith. He prays that no true Christian would fall away but remain true to the faith until the end.

Jesus prays for the consolation of his people.

But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves – Jn. 17:13

Jesus prays that through the comfort and consolation of his Spirit his people would know his joy and peace.

Jesus prays for the protection of his people.

I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world -Jn. 17:14-16

Jesus prays for his Father to protect his people, whom the world hates, from the malice of sinners and the wiles of the evil one.

Jesus prays for the sanctification of his people.

Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth – Jn. 17:17-19

Jesus prays for the Father to conform his people to his image by the Word of God and the work of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus prays for unity among his people.

I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me - Jn. 17:20-23.

Jesus prays that all who believe in him will be united into one spiritual family and society.

Jesus prays for the glorification of his people.

Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world - Jn. 17:24

Jesus prays for every true believer to be with him in heaven and to experience the glory that awaits them as the children of God and co-heirs with him.

Jesus prays for the edification of his people.

O righteous Father, even though the world does not know you, I know you, and these know that you have sent me. I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them -Jn. 17:25-26

Jesus prays that his people will edify each other in love, through his love for them and presence with them, by his Spirit who indwells them.

What a joy to know that Jesus intercedes for us in heaven at the Father's right hand. How blessed we are to have the prayers of our crucified, risen, and ascended Savior who prays for our preservation, consolation, protection, sanctification, unity, glorification, and edification. Not sometimes but at all times. For Jesus always lives to make intercession for his people. As Scottish Presbyterian Robert Murray M'Cheyne once said: 'If I could hear Christ praying for me in the next room, I would not fear a million of enemies. Yet the distance makes no difference; he is praying for me.' Amen. Thank you, Jesus.


