#### Persistence in Prayer

And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. – Lk. 18:1

Many Christians struggle to pray. Even the renowned theologian J. I. Packer confessed he found prayer to be challenging. In a book he co-authored with Carolyn Nystrom, titled, *Praying*, Packer writes, "while prayer is unquestionably natural, necessary and normal for Christian people, it constantly proves in practice to be the very opposite of plain sailing." Very true.

While there are several reasons why Christians find prayer difficult, I think one major reason concerns God's apparent lack of response. Because quick answers to prayer are not often forthcoming, many believers find their desire to pray tempered. After all, some may reason, "I prayed about this matter for weeks and nothing happened in response to my prayers, so why should I continue to pray? It appears to make no difference at all." Why indeed? Why persist in our prayers when it seems God is unwilling to respond? The simple answer is: because Jesus tells us to.

In Luke 18:1-8, Jesus told his disciples a parable about an importunate widow, who eventually was given justice by an unrighteous judge, in order to teach them to pray and not give up, even if God does not quickly answer their prayers. And what was true for the disciples in Christ's day is true for us. We must not lose heart when God does not give speedy answers to our prayers. Rather, we must patiently persist in our petitions to him.

And while our persistence is not a guarantee God will answer in the way we pray, as though our importunate petitioning strongarms God into giving us what he would not give otherwise, our persistence in prayer, despite no answers, is not without benefit. J. I. Packer in his book, *Praying*, cites four that I find encouraging.

First, persistent prayer glorifies God. It shows we appreciate God as the source of all that is good.

Second, persistent prayer reveals our hope is in God alone. When we tenaciously petition God in prayer despite his seeming silence, we show both the acuteness of our need and God's greatness as the only one who can meet that need. By this clarity with which we realize God is our only hope, we draw closer to him and grow in our dependence upon him.

Third, persistent prayer increases our thanksgiving to God. The more earnestly we seek God in prayer and the longer we wait for his answer, the more we will value it when it is given, and the greater will be our thankfulness and joy.

Fourth, persistent prayer strengthens the muscles of our faith. God's plans for us and the things for which we pray, may require him to withhold what we ask for until the best time and circumstances are reached. Thus, to keep petitioning God with patient persistence and to wait with expectation for his answer is sometimes necessary. And as we wait for God's answer, our faith in him grows stronger as we continue to exercise our spiritual muscles by importunate prayer.

So let us not lose heart when answers to our prayers do not come quickly. Instead, let us continue to persistently petition our great and gracious God who hears our prayers and always answers them, in his time and in his way, that proves best for us and glorifying to him.


