A Christian American

The Rev. John Witherspoon (1723-1794) played a key role in our nation's War of Independence. Few Americans have heard of him, but he is worthy of our attention for several reasons.

First, Rev. Witherspoon was a genuine Christian sound in the faith. He was a Calvinist whose theology resonated with the themes of human depravity, the free grace of God, and justification by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone apart from works.

Second, Rev. Witherspoon was an exemplary educator. He was president of the College of New Jersey (Princeton) for over twenty-five years. His graduates included a president of the United States, a vice-president, six members of the Continental Congress, twenty-one U.S. Senators, twelve governors, thirty judges, three Supreme Court judges, six members of the Constitutional Convention, and thirteen college presidents.

Third, Rev. Witherspoon was a great patriot and statesmen. He was a member of the Continental Congress and the only clergyman to sign the Declaration of Independence. His reputation as a "fiery" patriot was so well known that the British leadership, as late as 1778, considered him the chief leader of the revolutionary cause. As one member of the British Parliament put it, "cousin America has run off with a Presbyterian parson."

Fourth, Rev. Witherspoon was a serious churchman. He took a leading role in the formation of the American Presbyterian Church. For instance, at the Third General Assembly (1791), over two-thirds of the ministers were graduates of the College of New Jersey (Princeton), and nearly half had been his personal students.

Fifth, and most importantly, Rev. Witherspoon correctly balanced earthly and heavenly priorities. He was committed to the cause of independence and worked hard to achieve that aim, but he understood this political goal paled in comparison to spiritual and eternal causes. Thus, in his sermon titled, "The Dominion of Providence" he pleads with his hearers as they prepare for war:

I do not blame your ardor in preparing for the resolute defense of your temporal rights; but consider, I beseech you, the truly infinite importance of the salvation of your souls. Is it of much moment whether you and your children shall be rich or poor, at liberty or in bonds? And is it of less moment, my brethren, whether you shall be the heirs of glory or the heirs of hell? ... I beseech you in the most earnest manner, to attend to 'the things that belong to your peace, before they are hid from your eyes." I would therefore earnestly press the apostle's exhortation, "Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation." There can be no true religion, till there be a discovery of your lost state by nature and practice, and an unfeigned acceptance of Christ Jesus, as he is offered in the gospel ... Believe it, "There is no salvation in any other." "There is no other name under heaven given amongst men by which we must be saved."

The Rev. John Witherspoon was a devout Christian of the Revolutionary era. He was an exemplary educator, a serious churchman, and an earnest pastor. He was a great patriot and statesmen, committed to the "resolute defense" of American "civil and religious liberties." He played a key role in the founding of this nation. Yet his ultimate commitment was to Jesus Christ and his eternal kingdom. May God grant our nation leaders like Rev. John Witherspoon. We are in dire need of men like him today.
