Delight and Desires By Randy Borill

"Fret not thyself because of evildoers, neither be thou envious against the workers of iniquity. For they shall soon be cut down like the grass, and wither as the green herb. Trust in the Lord, and do good; so shall thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed. Delight thyself also in the Lord; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart" Psalm 37;1-4

On August 10, the Washington Post reported that "Historians privately warned [President] Biden that America's democracy is teetering". This coincides with the public sentiment today that this is a time of a great deal of trouble and "fret" in the US and in fact, the world over. Granted, these feelings will come, but we are not obliged to invite or encourage them. Luther said, "We cannot preclude the birds from flying around our heads, but we can prevent them from building their nests in our hair."

There are sufficient evildoers in society, both the profane and those who profess religion to annoy the spirit and trouble the believer with grief. Our troubles are political, commercial, and social, and everywhere there is distress and misery. But, our text provides a remedy for us as it did for those who preceded us and experienced the same.

First, we are told to "*Trust in the Lord, and do good*", and in doing so there is promised consequential blessings. We see from the teachings of Christ that "trusting or believing and doing good" are intimately connected when he answered those who questioned him, "*Then said they unto him, 'What shall we do, that we might work the works of God? Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent.*" *John 6:28-29* If we are believing in Jesus, with patience we shall see the removal of the evildoers that trouble us without envying them. Should the eagle that drinks in the splendors of the sun above the clouds, envy and fret over the worm that only rises in blindness above the dust? Neither should we who have tasted of the heavenly gift and have been made partakers of the Holy Ghost, fret over the disturbances of blind evildoers.

Second, we are told to "Delight thyself also in the Lord," and again, promised consequential blessings follow. Mr. Worldly wise man says, "But, I thought religion was all self-denial; I never imagined that in loving God we could have our desires." As Christians, we have two selves: the old self and it is here that we deny the flesh with its affections and lusts. Then, there is the new self; the new man in Christ, and this does not consist in any self-denial. His tastes have changed; his desires have been altered to be consistent with the Lord's. Thus, he delights himself in his God, and joyously receives the desire of his heart . . . even with temporal prosperity: "so shall thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed".


