What is the Gospel? By Ruling Elder Cleve Chandler

Is it a person, is it the Bible, is it the teachings of Jesus? Is it what Jesus calls himself?

In one sense, the whole Bible is the Gospel and anyone can find examples of all the questions above in the Bible.

If one passage was used to explain the gospel and claim to be the gospel, it would be 1 Corinthians 15: 1-4. Paul wrote to the believers in Christ, reminding them of the gospel message Paul shared with them. (This Corinthian passage contains the word "gospel") and Paul claimed that what he was about to remind them of in his letter to them that the gospel was the absolute truth about the person of Christ. In other words, these statements are "no lie" but are nonnegotiable, undisputed, unequivable "truth" about Jesus Christ. Jesus stated about himself "I am the way, the TRUTH and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6

What does Paul remind the Corinthians of being the gospel, the truth? Paul states in essence of V1 & 2 of 1 Corinthians 15 "that you received this truthful message about Jesus making it your own story. You stand by it and your eternal life, your salvation has been a guarantee." In V3-5, Paul states (by paraphase) "What I told you about was what Jesus, the Redeemer told me, that he died for our sins, that is found in the Word of God, that he was buried and that he was raised from death on the third day and Jesus showed himself alive to Cephas, (Peter) then to his 12 closest disciples then to others, proving His Resurrection."

After this gospel of Jesus, comes more truth of the results of His work, the gospel of the saving work of Christ for sinners like us.

Only two will be highlighted in this writing—justification and sanctification.

The Westminster Shorter Catechism Q33 states the answer to "what is justification?" Justification is an act of God's free grace, wherein he pardons all our sins and accepts us as righteous in His sight, only for the right-eousness of Christ imputed to us and received by faith alone. Romans 3:24 "being justified freely by his grace, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.

Q35 What is Sanctification? Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, whereby we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die unto sin and live unto righteousness. Dr. Guy Waters of Reformed Seminary states "Justification addresses the guilt of our sin, sanctification addresses the dominion and corruption of sin in our lives." To renew and transform our entire being. Romans 6: 1-23


