### The Blind Hymnist

And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose – Rom. 8:28

Fanny Crosby was an incredible Christian woman. She was born on March 24, 1820 in Putnam County, New York. At six weeks old, she caught a cold that caused inflammation in her eyes. When her parents called on the family doctor, they learned he was not at home and were told someone else would come by to help. When the man arrived, he recommended that hot poultices be placed on her eyes. Tragically, the prescribed treatment caused Fanny to lose her eyesight.

Shortly afterward, at six months old and now blind, tragedy struck Fanny again, when her father suddenly died. Although she was now without a father, Fanny had a loving mother and maternal grandmother who took her to church and taught her to follow Jesus. Incredibly, by the age of fifteen, Fanny had memorized the four gospels, the Pentateuch, the Book of Proverbs, the Song of Solomon, and most of the Book of Psalms.

In 1835, Fanny enrolled at the New York Institution for the Blind, where she remained for eight years. During her time at the institution, she became an accomplished soprano singer, learned to play the piano, organ, harp and guitar, and met her future husband, Alexander Van Alstyne, a blind musician whom she married in 1858 at the age of thirty-eight. They had one child who died in infancy.

Although Fanny Crosby is known mostly for her hymns, nearly nine thousand before her death at age ninety-four, she did not write her first hymn until she was forty-one. Some of her hymns include the well-know songs, "Blessed Assurance," "Rescue the Perishing," "Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross," "Praise Him, Praise Him," "Saved by Grace," and "To God Be the Glory."

In addition to her hymn writing, Fanny Crosby was a popular speaker. She went to the White House on several occasions as the guest of Presidents John Quincy Adams, John Tyler, Andrew Johnson, and Grover Cleveland. Her friends included many famous people. Yet her fame never made her lose sight of what she viewed as her life's overarching purpose; to present the gospel message of her crucified and risen Savior to anyone who would listen.

Fanny Crosby was a gifted Christian musician who happened to be blind. For ninety-four years she lived without seeing because a medical treatment went horribly wrong. Yet she was never bitter over the loss of her sight and once stated, "It seemed intended by the blessed providence of God that I should be blind all my life, and I thank him for the dispensation. If perfect earthly sight were offered me tomorrow, I would not accept it. I might not have written or sung hymns to the praise of God if I had been distracted by the beautiful and interesting things about me. When a minister once confided he wished God had given her the ability to see, she replied, "If I had been given a choice at birth, I would have asked to be blind... for when I get to heaven, the first face I will see will be the One who died for me."

The life of Fanny Crosby wonderfully illustrates the truth of Romans 8:28, "that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to his purpose." For Fanny never viewed her blindness as a disability keeping her from reaching her full potential, but the very means by which God enabled her to accomplish all he had purposed for her life. Truly, in the words of William Cowper, "God moves in mysterious ways, his wonders to perform."

We express our sincere sympathy and love to the Price family in the death of Ms. Stella Price who went home to be with the Lord on Monday, October 21, 2024.
